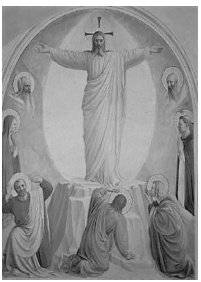
**The Sick & Retired Priests' Fund collection is next week**

I wonder how many of you have a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in your home. This image, with Jesus' heart on fire with love and crowned with thorn must be one the most cherished portrayals of Our Lord. It symbolizes Jesus' deep personal love for each of us. Some people have criticized this devotion as being too emotional or even lacking intellectual depth, but they miss the point that faith speaks both to the mind and to the heart. Faith is not just a matter of abstract beliefs: it's an invitation to encounter God in a personal and transformative way.

In his latest encyclical (or teaching letter) Pope Francis teaches us very clearly about this. It has just been published and contains many treasures for us. The title 'Delixit Nos' is Latin for 'He loved us' - a direct reference to the love of Jesus expressed fully on the cross. We are called by the love of Jesus to serve one another, especially those in need. The Pope reminds us that faith is never a private affair - yes it is personal, but it must also reach out to the world around us. As we reflect on this message during Remembrance Weekend, we are reminded of those who have this love to its fullest expressions, the men and women who have laid down their lives for their friends, family and the values we all hold dear.

Towards the end of the Encyclical, Pope Francis reminds us of the contrast between the values of the secular world and the values of the gospel:

"In a world where everything is bought and sold, people's sense of their worth appears increasingly to depend on what they can accumulate with the power of money. We are constantly being pushed to keep buying, consuming, and distracting ourselves, held captive to a demeaning system that prevents us from looking beyond our immediate and petty needs. The love of Christ has no place in this perverse mechanism, yet only that love can set us free from a mad pursuit that no longer has room for a gratuitous love. Christ's love can give a heart to our world and revive love wherever we think that the ability to love has been definitively lost" (No. 218).

Let us make the traditional invocation of the Sacred Heart our own: 'Lord Jesus, make my heart like unto your heart!'

 Brent deanery has organised a pilgrimage to Rome during the Holy Year of 2025.
