

In the next couple of weeks, something very different will be happening at the end of the Sunday Masses here at Kensal Rise. Some of you may already know that the whole of Catholic Church has been called by Pope Francis to take part in what is called the Synodal process. This began in 2021 and in many parishes of the diocese, a consultation process took place over four weeks in November and December. This was not possible at Kensal Rise, but now you have the chance to take part in this process.

Pope Francis has called for this Synodal (a word whose origins mean 'walking together') process, recognizing the need for a more inclusive and participatory Church. He teaches us that this will be a time for us all to come together, clergy and laity alike, to share our insights, experiences and concerns. The Synod is an opportunity to listen to the voices of the entire Church, to discern the signs of the times and how the Spirit is leading us into the future.

Cardinal Nichols has asked that all parishes in the diocese take part in a consultation in the lead up to the meeting of Synod in Rome later this year. Over the next two weeks, therefore, we will be taking part in this process in Kensal Rise. I am very keen that as many people can be included in this consultation as possible, and so at the end of the Masses on 17/18 and 24/25 of February, you will have a chance to reflect on 2 very simple questions about our sense of mission suggested by the Cardinal. You will then be asked to write, anonymously, just a few words about this reflection on a Post It note, and these reflections will be collated and passed to the Diocese. We will then display your reflections so that we can read what others have said. I understand that this process may seem very strange to some of you, and you may have read views both for and against what the Pope is asking us to do. I consider that this will help us all in this parish to discern some of our priorities for the future, as well as taking part in the Synodal process. I ask you to have an open mind and to take part in our discussions prayerfully and openly.
