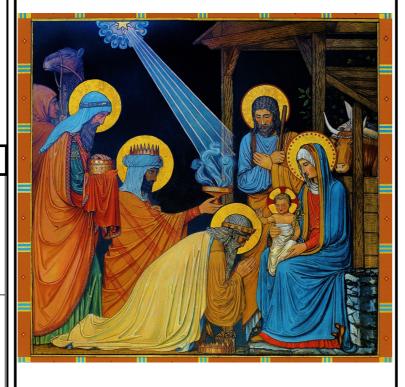

HAPPY NEW YEAR

Some of you may remember that I received an interesting motto in one of the Christmas Crackers I pulled this year. It wasn't a joke – it said it was a conversation starter and it went like this: 'What habit would you most like to give up in the coming year?'. If you ask my friends, I think they would say my habit of humming, singing or whistling to myself all the time. My life seems to need a musical soundtrack to it, provided either by the wireless or by me. I think my friends would say that a good New Year's resolution for me would be to give up singing!

New Year is a chance for new beginnings, and maybe you are making New Year resolutions. They might be around sweets and iPhones for some of you, and they might be around alcohol and tobacco or vaping for some of the adults (or dare I say teenagers) among us. It is so good that the New Year in the life of the Church begins with the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, and she can inspire us in making our New Year resolutions.
