My dear friends in Christ,

I can't believe that I am sitting in the office with Chelsea writing a short Christmas message to you all. Where has 2019 gone!

Talking to some parishioners about how quickly time flies, they all agreed that this year seems to have been the quickest they have ever known, and I can vouch for that.

In fact, looking back as I prepare for my 17th Christmas as Parish Priest, these years have flown by.

2019 brought to me the great joys and sorrows of sharing your lives. I have had the privilege of baptising 30 of your children, hearing the children's first confessions and giving them the Lord in their First Holy Communion, talking to the young people about Confirmation, preparing couples for marriage, being at the bedside of the dying and sending your loved ones to God. He gave us all the Sacraments which I have just spoken about, they are glimpses of His love and strengthen us on our journey. He came to show His love for us and to guide us home. If we hold fast to His teaching and do our best to live out His law of love, which is of course the love of God and the love of neighbour, we will truly be happy in this life and in the next. And that is what Christ wants for us: our happiness.

In your daily lives especially over the Christmas season, try and bring the joy and happiness that your faith should bring to you into the lives of those around you, because Christ is a generous lover, he does not wish for us to keep his love for ourselves but to share it with all.

Make Christmas a time of reconciliation and forgiveness, ensure that any wounds that you have, any old arguments or feuds are forgiven and forgotten. Only this kind of forgiveness can remove resentment and bitterness and hatred from our hearts. Then we can all truly celebrate the birth of the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

As we prepare to enter a new year we do so full of confidence, that we do not walk alone, and that Christ is holding our hand. And if we keep a tight grip on that hand only happiness and hope will fill our hearts.

Wishing you all a very happy and holy Christmas, with my prayers gratitude and deepest thanks for your kindness to me,
