I had to turn around this week. It was a bit embarrassing, really. I had had a busy day, and I needed to get somewhere to make a 3.30 appointment. I rushed down the stairs at Willesden Green station, and said a quick prayer of thanks that a train was just coming into the platform. I boarded and found my preferred seat, opened the Ian Rankin crime thriller I am reading at the moment and settled down. So far, so good. I sensed two stops go past, but did not pay much attention. Then I looked up and couldn't work out why I was at Finchley Road when I wanted to be at Wembley Park. Then it dawned on me that I was going the wrong way. Force of habit had made me get on a southbound train, my usual direction of travel, instead of northbound train I needed. I had to turn around.

The gospel today is the first verses of Mark's gospel. It focusses our attention on the enigmatic figure of John the Baptist. This strange man who seemed to attract so many to his message, even though it would hardly seem to be a popular one. At its heart lies the word which repentance and repentance always involves turning round, a change of direction. I think many people find themselves rather shop soiled by life, a little bit worn out; a little bit trapped by routine.

We need to hear John's call of repentance. While children are eagerly awaiting the gifts and excitement of Christmas, adults should use Advent in a different way. Our response to John the Baptist's call should be to look at our lives, and try to get rid of the habitual ways of thinking which take us in the wrong direction, away from God. In the same way as we prepare our homes for a visitor by cleaning, tidying, cooking so we should prepare our hearts to welcome Christ with prayer, confession and renewed joy. We need to make sure that we are travelling towards God: heeding the words of the prophet Isaiah, we need to turn around and travel along the straight highway of God.
