VISIBLE AND INVISIBLE.

Last Thursday I visited the Convent of Jesus and Mary Infant school, and spoke with the children in year 1. I brought in with me an old Paschal candle and we went through the symbolism of it – a light in darkness, the five wounds of Jesus, the Alpha and the Omega. Most importantly, I told them that it symbolises the presence of the Risen Christ among us. They appeared to have no problem with this – for young children the difference between what is visible and what is invisible is not very significant. But as they get older, it will become a bigger problem for them.

In the Nicene Creed we all say 'I believe in one God...maker of all things visible and invisible.' For many people in the modern world, brought up on science and its use of the material world, it is hard to believe in things which are invisible. I wonder what many of the 18 million or so who watched the Coronation Service made of the Anglican Communion service, which was at its heart. Maybe it gave some of them pause for thought, and a chance to realise that there is more to the world that just what we can see, touch, hear and taste.

In the gospel today, Jesus is gently moving his friends from being able to see him to a time when he will be invisible. On Thursday we will be celebrating the Ascension of Jesus, when he physically left the created order, and promised us the Holy Spirit. We move from the world of the visible to the world of the invisible. We truly move into the world of faith, one which we as people of faith, as Catholics, accept, but many around us do not

Of course, Jesus is visible to us in the life of the Church, and above all in the Host, the Body of Chris, in the Mass. But we have a responsibility to make him visible to those around us through our own words and actions. In this great prayer of St Teresa of Avila we can see how we can make Christ visible to our own world:

Christ has no body but yours,
No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Yours are the eyes with which he looks with compassion on this world,
Christ has no body but yours.
