Ut Omnes Unum sint – May they all be one.

My parents were married in 1950 in a beautiful Church of England church in Little Gaddesen in Buckinghamshire. As well as family, many friends were invited, and one of them was Catholic. My mother was not impressed by the fact that her friend felt she had to ask the permission of priest even to enter a Protestant church, and that she was then told she must not join in with any of the prayers, even the Our Father. Thank God 70 years later the world has changed. At the canonisation of St John Henry Newman the place of honour was given to the then Prince of Wales, now our King. I heard the King make a beautiful speech afterwards which was full of courtesy and understanding of Newman's journey into the Catholic Church. Such a thing would have been impossible 60 years previously, and would perhaps have been the cause of violence and martyrdom in previous centuries.

One of the great fruits of the Second Vatican Council has been Ecumenism, the desire for Christian Unity. The Church has a solid base on which to build her ecumenical dialogue – The Decree on Ecumenism – which set the stage for Catholic dialogue with our Orthodox, Protestant and Anglican brothers and sisters. In the Prison Service, I worked as closely as I could with the other Christian groups. Of course there were separate services on Sunday – Mass for us and Worship for the others – but we co-operated with putting on Alpha courses and reducing re-offending courses which witnessed to our common faith.

St Paul, in the second reading, speaks of the scandal of disunity even among the earliest Christians. It is a sign of our fallen nature. But I know that many of you work and pray for unity in your own lives, with non-Catholic friends, and some of you in mixed marriages.

Our prayers for unity are being answered, thank God. But we must continue to pray so that in an increasingly divided and angry world we might be known for our love for each other.
