

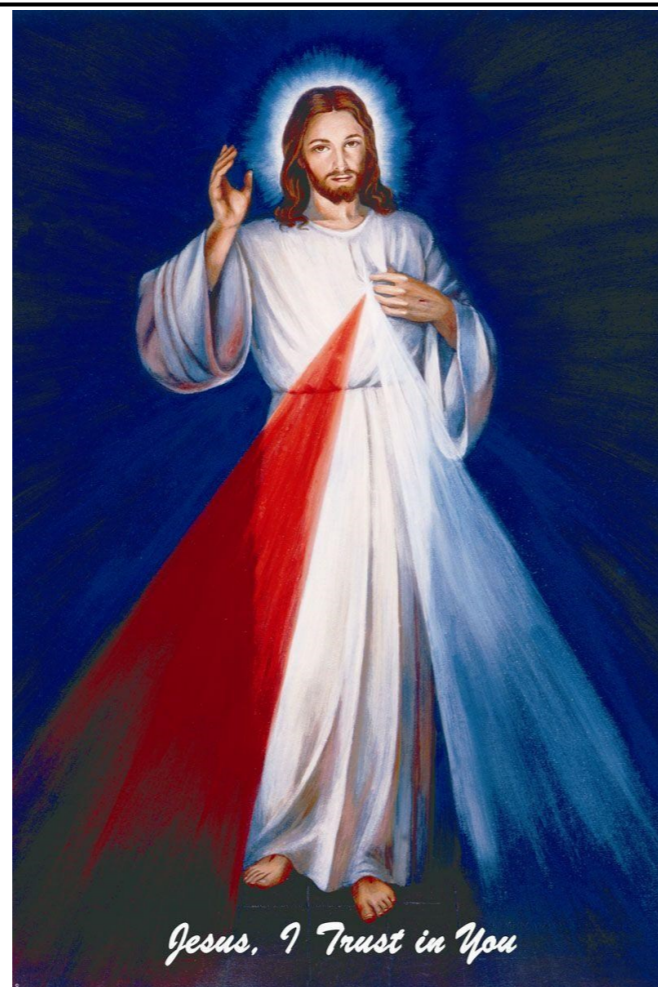

HAPPY ARE THOSE WHO HAVE NOT SEEN AND YET BELIEVE.

It is one of the great privileges of the priest to go to a house where someone has just died and pray with them and with those who have just been bereaved. Most often, the person who has just died is still lying in their bed, surrounded by their tablets, medicines and often some holy pictures. The person usually looks very calm, and almost as if they are asleep, but there is no doubt that they have died: they are so still.

No wonder that Thomas found it hard to believe that Jesus Christ had risen from the dead. He had probably seen several people who had died, and he knew how final this appears. He felt left out from the amazing experience which the other disciples had gone through. Like many others, maybe he had just wanted to be alone after his friend had died – his grief separating him from his friends. Perhaps he is jealous or hurt because they had seen something special when he was absent. You can imagine him saying, almost angrily, that he will only believe if he can put his finger into the wounds of Jesus. Like many of us, he knows what death looks like.

A week later, Thomas is given just this opportunity. It is beautiful to see that Jesus meets Thomas and accepts him just as he is – no scolding from Jesus about Thomas' lack of faith. He responds to Thomas cry even though this comes from a lack of trust.

There is so much here to reassure you and me. We may sometimes be jealous of others' faith when ours seems weak; we may think God is cross with us when we doubt his goodness; we may worry about loved ones who doubt God's goodness.

Thanks be to God for the doubts of Thomas, so that our faith may be built upon these doubts which called forth this beautiful encounter between doubt and faith, between Thomas and Jesus, between us and the God of love.
