This Parish is part of Westminster Roman Catholic Diocesan Trust (WRCDT) Registered Charity No: 233699 Did you ever feel like running away from home when you were a child? After a particularly difficult quarrel with my mother (my fault, always) I would fantasise about putting a few precious things into a bag and running away to start a new life. Of course, things would quickly calm down and life would return to normal – until the next time!

Sandwiched between our Old Testament reading and the Gospel is an extract from the shortest letter of St Paul, and perhaps the most moving. It shines a light onto the personal life of this great man, on his friendships and his care for others. A slave (this was a society where slavery was just accepted as part of the natural order – scandalous for us, normal for then) called Onesimus had run away from his master, Philemon, probably stealing some money as he went. Something pretty serious must have happened, because by running away, Onesimus was risking crucifixion, the punishment of slaves. Both he and his master had met Paul when he was in their home city of Colossae. Paul's humanity must have made a deep impression on this runaway. He found his way to Paul's place of house arrest, putting the apostle in a very difficult dilemma. Harbouring a slave was a crime; here was a young man in trouble; what would be best for him and his master?

Paul first shares the love of Jesus Christ with his friend, who becomes his spiritual son. The easy solution could well have been to keep Onesimus with him and say nothing. But Paul knew this was wrong. The more difficult – but correct – solution was to send Onesimus back to his master, but to tell Philemon how much the young man had changed, that he should be treated as a brother.

When we are confronted with problems in the family, at work or at school, there are often several choices before us. One is to run away from the issue – but that often just makes things worse. There can a be quick fix solution, maybe plastering over the issue but not healing it. Inspired by Jesus Christ, often the best way is the long term way – doing what is right, seeking healing and making a new start. May Jesus Christ give us the strength to do what is right.
