King Charles III when he was Prince of Wales at the Canonisation of St John Henry Newman (Catholic Bishops' Conference England & Wales)

There may have been some words from the Coronation service, which, for Catholics in England, might have been rather difficult to hear. They form part of the Oath of Allegiance, which the King took, as he said:

"I Charles do solemnly and sincerely in the presence of God profess, testify, and declare that I am a faithful Protestant..."

This oath was drawn up in very different times from our own, and they reflect the history which lies behind the monarchy in our lands. They are important in our own age also – the King has said that he is a faithful Anglican.

But, I hope you also saw something else which was also very significant at the Coronation. For the first time (I think) since the coronation of Queen Mary in 1553 there was a Catholic bishop taking part in the service – HE Cardinal Vincent Nichols. Over the past five hundred years or so, the Catholic Church in England has gone through many different times. From being the faith of the Monarch Henry VIII, the Church was then persecuted for centuries, with many dying for their faith. Then came the toleration of the Catholic Church, and the lifting of the many restrictions which Catholics endured. The Second Vatican Council has brought about a new relationship between the Church and other communions.

We have much to be grateful to King Charles for. The photograph above shows this so clearly. It was taken at the Canonisation of St John Henry Newman, a convert from the Church of England. It is a cause of great thanksgiving that centuries after the break with the Catholic Church and its persecution, the then Prince Charles was present at this Mass. This would have been unthinkable even fifty years ago. We must pray for our King, that God will give him the grace he needs as he begins his reign.
